The Mickelsons

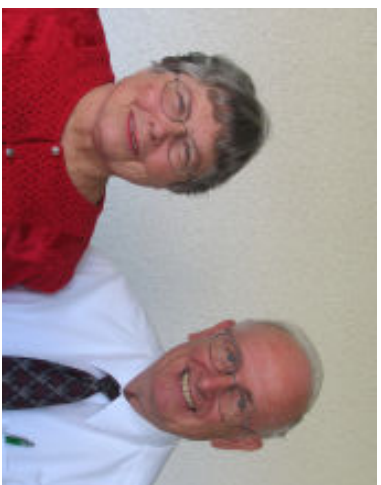

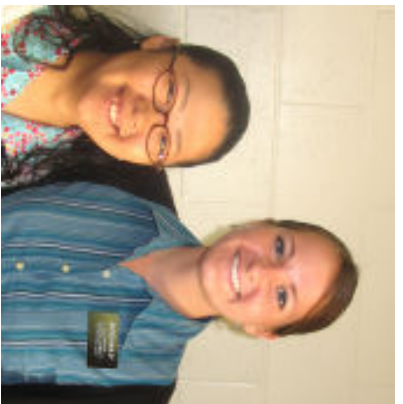

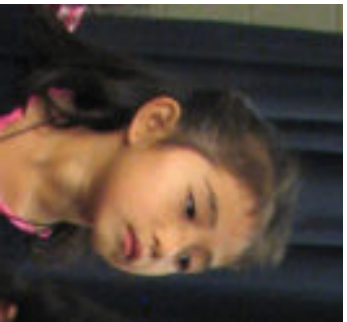
